THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

## STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. At all material times the Plaintiff, Ms. Mila Lee Foster, was a lawful pedestrian.
2. The Defendant, Raymond Irvin Scott, was at all material times the owner and operator of a blue 2009 Toyota Fortuner motor vehicle with registration number 135 668.
3. On or about the morning of 12 October 2020, the Plaintiff was walking East on West Side Road and crossing the junction at Cemetery Road, Cayman Brac. As the Plaintiff was lawfully crossing the roadway, she was violently struck on the right side of her body by the Defendant who was travelling West and making a right turn from West Side Road onto Cemetery Road.
4. The pedestrian knockdown was solely caused by the negligence of the Defendant. The Defendant breached his statutory duties under Sections 67 and 68 of the *Traffic Act 2021* and was cited for dangerous driving and inflicting grievous bodily harm.

## PARTICULARS

5. The Defendant was negligent and guilty of a breach of statutory duties by:
  - a. making a right turn too tight cutting into the wrong lane and encroaching on the right of way of the Plaintiff;
  - b. making an improper and illegal right hand turn when it was not clear to do so;
  - c. failing to exercise due care and attention when using the road and failing to have due regard to the safety of other road users;
  - d. failing to drive in such a manner as to have full control of the vehicle at all times;
  - e. driving at a speed which was too fast in the circumstances;
  - f. failing to keep any or any proper look out;
  - g. failing to see the pedestrian Plaintiff in time or at all;
  - h. failing to give way to the pedestrian Plaintiff on the road;

- i. failing to apply the brakes whether in time or at all;
  - j. failing to steer or control the vehicle so as to avoid the said collision;
  - k. failing to exercise reasonable skill and care to be expected of a reasonably skillful and careful driver in the circumstances;
  - l. driving a defective vehicle; and/or
  - m. failing to take reasonable care in all the circumstances.
6. The Plaintiff relies on the doctrine of *res ipsa loquitur*.
  7. By reason of the aforesaid, the Plaintiff has suffered serious personal injuries, losses and damages.

#### PARTICULARS OF INJURIES

8. The Plaintiff, whose date of birth is the 22 September 1976, was 44 years old at the date of the collision.
9. The Plaintiff suffered catastrophic and serious injuries as a result of the collision and continues to suffer as a result of the injuries sustained. The injuries include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - a. depressed open skull fracture;
  - b. severe head injury;
  - c. severe intracranial injury;
  - d. diffuse axonal brain injury;
  - e. diffuse traumatic brain injury;
  - f. fractured and broken teeth;
  - g. unconsciousness;
  - h. septal hematoma;
  - i. displaced fractures of the superior and inferior right pelvis;
  - j. trauma to her nose;
  - k. trauma to her left knee;

- l. trauma to her left ankle; and
- m. contusions and abrasions to her body.

10. After the collision, the Plaintiff was taken by Ambulance to Faith Hospital, Cayman Brac where she was admitted to the intensive care unit. The Plaintiff underwent a tracheostomy and was placed on mechanical ventilation with a PEG feeding tube. The Plaintiff scored 3 out of 15 on the Glasgow coma scale.

11. The Plaintiff has undergone extensive medical treatment for her serious injuries at both George Town and Faith Hospitals, and that treatment is ongoing. The Plaintiff requires assistance with all aspects of daily living and received six weeks of neuro-physiotherapy and rehabilitation treatment at Jackson Memorial Hospital Miami in the United States of America.

12. The extent to which the Plaintiff will be able to recover from her injuries is poor. Further and better particulars of the Plaintiff's injuries will be provided at trial.

#### PARTICULARS OF SPECIAL DAMAGES

13. The Plaintiff has suffered losses and incurred expenses as a result of the collision which are ongoing. Full particulars of special damage will be supplied at a later date by way of a schedule of damages, including but not limited to claims for loss of income, medical treatment, travel, equipment and gratuitous care, interest and costs. Full particulars of the Plaintiff's special damages and losses, which are continuing, will be provided at trial.

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

- (1) Damages;
- (2) Pre-Judgment interest in accordance with Section 34 of the *Judicature Act* (2017 Revision);
- (3) Post-Judgment interest in accordance with Section 34 of the *Judicature Act* (2017 Revision);

(4) Costs;

(5) Such further or other relief as this Honourable Court deems just.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is endorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2). The defence must be served within fourteen (14) days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not endorsed on the Writ, the defence need not be served until fourteen (14) days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for fourteen (14) days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of fourteen (14) days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further steps in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL HEALTH PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
