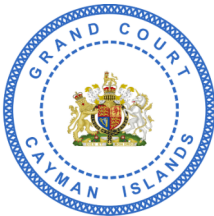

LET THE DEFENDANT, within 14 days after service of this Originating Summons on her, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman.

By this originating summons, which is issued on the application of the Plaintiff, Jeffrey Thomas Clifford of 316 Carib Sands, 195C Bert Marson Drive, West End, Cayman Brac, Cayman Islands, seeks the following orders and relief pursuant to section 14 of the Grand Court Act

(2015 Revision), section 18 of the Mental Health Act (2021 revision) and Grand Court Rules Order 80, rules 18 and 28:

1. That the Plaintiff be appointed guardian of the person and estate (the "**Guardian**") of Jacqueline Irene Susan Clifford (the "**Patient**").
2. That the Guardian may act for and for and on behalf of the Patient in relation to the provision of consent to any and all medical treatment which is required to be performed in the Cayman Islands in the future.
3. That the Plaintiff be appointed as receiver (the "**Receiver**") of the property of the Patient situated in the Cayman Islands (the "**Property**") with such powers as the Court shall direct.
4. That the Receiver do report and account to the Court at such intervals and on such terms as the Court may direct.
5. That the Receiver not be required to provide security for his appointment.
6. That the costs and expenses of the Receiver of and incidental to and consequential upon this application be paid on the indemnity basis out of the Property.
7. Liberty to apply for further directions.
8. Such further or alternative relief as the Court may consider appropriate.

If a Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to her as the Court may think just and expedient.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 28 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
