THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495, Grand Cayman, KY1-1106, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

## STATEMENT OF CLAIM

---

1. The Plaintiff is a strata corporation consisting of all proprietors contained in Strata Plan No. 155 pursuant to section 5(1) of the Strata Titles Registration Act (2013 Revision) (hereinafter the "Act"). The Plaintiff's address for service is care of its Attorneys, HSM Chambers, 68 Fort Street, George Town, P.O. Box 31726, Grand Cayman, KY1-1207, Cayman Islands.
2. The Defendant is an individual who previously resided in the Cayman Islands with a mailing address of P.O. Box 174, Grand Cayman, KY1-1104, Cayman Islands. The Defendant is the registered proprietor of the property known as #66 Randyke Gardens and situate as Registration Section George Town East, Block 20E, Parcel 310H66 (the "Property"), a residential development subject of Strata Plan No. 155.
3. The Duties and Powers of Strata Plan No. 155 are set out in section 6 of the Act, which states *inter alia*, as follows:

*"...(2) The powers of a corporation include the following- (a) to establish a fund for administrative expenses sufficient in the opinion of such corporation for the control, management and administration of the common property, for the payment of any premiums of insurance and for the discharge of any of its other obligations; (b) to determine, from time to time, the amounts to be raised for the fund referred to in paragraph (a) and to raise amounts so determined by levying contributions on the proprietors in proportion to the unit entitlement of their respective lots."*
4. The Plaintiff exercised such powers by both establishing a fund for administrative expenses and by determining from time to time the amounts to be raised for the fund by administrative expenses.
5. The amounts to be allocated for administrative expenses were determined by way of resolutions of the Executive Committee of the Plaintiff and approval of such resolutions were given at the Annual General Meeting of the Plaintiff.
6. In accordance with section 21 of the Act the control, management, administration, use and enjoyment of Strata Plan No. 155 must be regulated by By-laws. Strata Plan No. 155 has its own By-laws which state, *inter alia*, as follows:

***"Proprietors' Obligations***

41. A Proprietor shall:-

....

*(b) pay all rates, taxes, charges, outgoings and assessments that may be payable in respect of his Strata Lot;*

*(c) pay to the Corporation within 14 days of demand:-*

*(i) all contributions to the fund for administrative expenses levied by the Corporation pursuant to Clause 6(2) of the Law; and*

*(ii) such shares as shall from time to time be proportionate to the unit entitlement of the Strata Lots comprising Randyke Gardens of all and any costs and expenses incurred by the Corporation in connection with performance of its duties under the Law and under these By-laws*

*PROVIDED ALWAYS that:*

*(A) in the event of any such payments not being made within 14 days of such demand he shall pay interest thereon at the rate of four percent (4%) per annum above the Prime Rate prevailing at Barclays Bank PLC, George Town, Grand Cayman for loans in United States Dollars at the time of default which such interest shall accrue from day to day until payment..."*

7. In breach of the By-laws, the Defendant has defaulted on her monthly strata payments and as of 30 September 2021 owed to the Plaintiff the principal sum of CI\$20,905.00.
8. The interest rate applied to the outstanding debt from 1 February 2012 continues to accrue in accordance with the By-laws. The Plaintiff used Barclays Bank's Base Rate taken from the Barclays UK website, as Barclays no longer operates in the Cayman Islands.
9. The Defendant has failed to make full payment to the Plaintiff as and when due, notwithstanding a Demand Letter dated 16 January 2020 being served upon the Defendant via Registered Mail and attempts made to contact by various means. The Plaintiff has suffered loss and damage as a result.
10. As a result of the above, the Plaintiff is entitled to the relief claimed in this proceeding.

**AND THE PLAINTIFF** claims:

- a) CI\$20,905.00 being the sum due as at 30 September 2021;
- b) Pre-judgment interest from 1 February 2012 to 3 August 2016 at the rate of 4.5% per annum in accordance with the terms of the By-laws.
- c) Pre-Judgment interest from 4 August 2016 to 1 November 2017 at a rate of 4.25% per annum in accordance with the terms of the By-laws.
- d) Pre-Judgment interest from 2 November 2017 to 1 August 2018 at a rate of 4.5% per annum in accordance with the terms of the By-laws.
- e) Pre-Judgment interest from 2 August 2018 to 10 March 2020 at a rate of 4.75% per annum in accordance with the terms of the By-laws.
- f) Pre-Judgment interest from 11 March 2020 to 18 March 2020 at a rate of 4.25% per annum in accordance with the terms of the By-laws.
- g) Pre and post-judgment interest from 19 March 2020 and continuing at a rate of 4.1% per annum in accordance with the terms of the By-laws.
- h) Alternatively, the Plaintiff claims interest in accordance with s.34 of the Judicature Act (2021 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules (2021 Revision) for the same period and interest to continue at CI\$1.67 per diem until the debt has been paid in full.
- i) Costs to be taxed if not agreed; and
- a) Such further and other relief as this Court may deem just.

## **INDORSEMENT**

The principal amount claimed in respect of the debt is CI\$20,905.00. The amount of the filing fees to commence the proceeding is CI\$200.00 plus Ad Valorem in the sum of CI\$109.05. If, within the time for returning the acknowledgement of service, the defendants pay the Plaintiff or its attorneys-at-law the total amount claimed in principal, interest and the costs of issuing the Writ of Summons, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or to its attorneys-at-law.

## **INDORSEMENT REGARDING INTEREST**

1. The contractual term upon which interest is claimed is as set out in paragraph 6 above;
2. The prescribed rate of interest is 4.5% per annum up to 3 August 2016 and from 4 August 2016 to 1 November 2017 at a rate of 4.25% and from 2 November 2017 to 1 August 2018 at a rate of 4.5% per annum and from 2 August 2018 to 10 March 2020 at a rate of 4.75% and from 11 March 2020 to 18 March 2020 at a rate of 4.25% and thereafter at the prescribed rate of 4.1%, continuing to accrue.
3. The amount of interest accruing is CI\$2.35 per diem.
4. Alternatively, the applicable rate of interest will be 2.38% per annum at a rate of CI\$1.67 per diem.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of each Defendant or by each Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495 GT, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

### Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
