By this Summons, which is issued on the application of MARVIN ROBERT JOHNSON, The Plaintiff seeks the Court's determination that:

1. The estate of Luthidia Helen Ersell Johnson (also known as Beverly Johnson and Beverly Helen Johnson) be administered in accordance with Section 29 of the

- Succession Law (2021 Revision), in that the Plaintiff is to receive an equal share pursuant to section 30 Succession Law (2021 Revision) of the estate.
2. Alternatively, Carolyn Woodman be removed as Administratrix of the Estate of Luthidia Helen Ersell Johnson (also known as Beverly Johnson and Beverly Helen Johnson) pursuant to Section 8 of the Succession Law (2021 Revision).
 3. There be such and further relief as this Honourable Court deem just in the circumstances.

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgement may be given, or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICES
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there is more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 28 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)"
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....) after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY, the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf of the Company, but the

Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.

8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
