THIS PLAINT has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after service of this **Plaint** on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman KY1-1106, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service form stating therein whether you intend to contest this action. If you intend to defend the action, in whole or in part, you must set out **full particulars of your defence** in the space provided in the Acknowledgement of Service form.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or fail to return the Acknowledgement of Service form containing full particulars of your defence, the Plaintiff may apply for a **default Judgement** without any further notice to you.

PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

- 1 On or around August 6, 2023, the plaintiff purchased a 2012 blue Honda Fit and took possession of said vehicle from the seller. Deposit of CI \$6500.00 and remaining balance of \$500.00 to be paid over the following month by September 6, 2023.
- 2 On or around August 2023, the plaintiff allowed the defendant to temporarily register the Honda Fit for her use, as the Defendants vehicle needed repairs and she was financial incapable of facilitating the repairs at said time. The Defendant was aware that this was a temporary situation.

Further the Defendant suggested to transfer previous insurance from her broken vehicle to the Honda Fit to have it licensed but understood that once repairs were concluded on her personal vehicle that she would facilitate for the registration of the Honda Fit to the Plaintiff as the owner.
- 3 On or around the 19th of October 2023, the Defendant discarded the Plaintiffs personal belongings from the home they shared and contacted the police to have the Plaintiff removed from the property. The Plaintiff left the property with the vehicle and has retained possession of the vehicle since this incident.
- 4 On 30th of November 2023, the Plaintiff and the Defendant agreed to attend the Department of Vehicle Licensing to transfer registration to the Plaintiff as the rightful owner of said vehicle.
- 5 On 30th of November 2023, the Defendant assaulted the Plaintiff and refused to transfer ownership of vehicle due to her dissatisfaction that her personal relationship with the Plaintiff had ended and that the Plaintiff only wished to lawfully take possession of his property.
- 6 On 30th of November 2023, the Plaintiff attended the Bodden Town Police Station to make a statement regarding the actions of the defendant, including the disposal/ damage of the logbook for the vehicle, and other personal legal documents.
- 7 On 30th of November 2023, the defendant threw rocks at Plaintiff while he was attempting to drive away and caused damage to the vehicle.
- 8 On or around 1st December 2023, the Plaintiff was contacted by the officers at the Bodden Town Police Station, to collect some of his property that the Defendant had previously removed from his vehicle.
- 9 The Defendant has caused physical and severe financial hardship to the Plaintiff with these malicious acts.

- 10 The Defendant attempted to ruin the Plaintiff's legal and working status, in addition causing monetary loss to the Plaintiff for the cost of obtaining official reports and fees incurred for the application of a replacement of documents.
- 11 The Defendant has repeatedly indicated that she will not sign the documents if the Plaintiff does not return to a relationship with her. The Defendant has expressed to others that she does not desire to return ownership of the Honda Fit.

AND the Plaintiff claims:

- (1) The sum of CI\$7,000.00 for the purchase of the Honda Fit if the Defendant will not legally return registration and documents for the vehicle to the Plaintiff.
- (2) The sum of CI\$400.00 for the replacement of documents.
- (3) The sum of CI\$1000.00 for the repairs of damaged caused to vehicle.
- (3) Interest to continue until this matter is settled.
- (4) Fixed costs of \$175.00, alternatively costs to be assessed.
