PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

(Here set out in numbered paragraphs the grounds upon which the Plaintiff claims that the Defendant is

indebted to her or is liable to pay her for not having access to the Car since December 7, 2023, because of Police Negligence that caused Keith and Marlene Barnes to harass Ms. Lovell Marriott with violence, harassment, and threatening violence.

The Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS) Police Negligence has caused misery and disrupted the peace, Ms. Marriott does not have access to her car and has to walk miles daily to beg for a ride to get around in the sun. The Cayman Police Department (RCIPS) must take full responsibility.

1. On December 7, 2023, Keith Barnes towed his dump truck and used it to block Ms. Lovell Marriott's car in her driveway before her apartment at Randyke Garden Apartment #25. His truck is parked 6 inches away from the driver's door, making it impossible to open her car door. The car battery ran down, the tires were flat, and the abstraction of the truck made it impossible to service her Car. The matter was reported to 911 over 10 times. Ms. Marriott met and spoke with the Woman Inspector on duty at the George Town Police station she promised officers would make contact with Barnes and have his truck removed.

2. Keith Barnes owner of Apartment #26 claimed a parking space belonging to him, so he refused to remove his truck.


3. Police Officers spoke to Barnes to remove his truck and he refused to do so. Keith Barnes told the Police Officers he would not remove his truck. To date, the truck is still there. Ms. Lovell Marriott wrote to the Governors, Deputy Governor Office, and Commissioner of Police Office in December 2023 and twice in 2024, requesting Keith Barnes remove his condemned truck Inspector Dyer replied that Chief Inspector Maxwell was dealing with the matter.

This amount should be paid by 2nd May 2024 to avoid a 50% interest rate added to the sum.
